Cullen Gallagher, senior at Eastern Nazarene College, is preparing to graduate and tackle the world like the rest of his class. There's just one difference - Cullen is visually impaired. Despite this obstacle, it has never stopped him from achieving his goals and keeping his sights on accomplishing great feats in his life.

One of the reasons Cullen chose ENC was its Christian culture. He enjoys going to chapel each week and being part of the campus' Christian tradition. Coming from a Catholic background, he felt the school would be perfect in supporting him from a spiritual standpoint.



Previous to ENC, Cullen attended Perkins School for the Blind, so attending a mainstream school for the first time was a major change to his academic life. Throughout his time on campus, ENC provided unflagging support for his academic and spiritual life.

Cullen credits his success at ENC to the support of his various professors and the Center for Academic Success, which allowed him to take exams in an accessible format and helped him with assignments. With his experience at ENC, he has great hope for the college to continue being a great support for visually impaired students.

Outside the classroom, Cullen is involved with the National Federation of the Blind, an advocacy group comprised of visually impaired people from all over the United

States. He joined the organization a few months after attending his first national convention in Orlando in 2015. After five years of membership, he was elected to the Board of Directors of the National Federation of the Blind for the affiliation of Massachusetts. Just one year later, he was promoted to Second Vice President. His advocacy work centers on access to technology and employment resources.


Cullen knows that ENC was the perfect choice for continuing his education and the support he's received will allow him to continue his work of advocating for himself and others with visual impairments.




