Meet Jose Ruiz ('22)



Major: Global business and environmental studies

Hometown: Jerez De la Frontera, Spain

While currently studying online with us in his home country of Spain due to COVID-19, Jose Ruiz ('22) is never far from ENC. Jose is a global business and environmental studies major at ENC with a minor in finance. He's also also the founder of his own company, JOAGA, an entrepreneurial venture using ocean waste to create sustainable products.

On a surfing trip to Indonesia, the second largest contributor of ocean waste, Jose realized how much waste was occupying the beaches there. A short six months later, Jose and his business partner developed a watch made from recycled ocean waste, recycled steel, and pineapple waste.

Jose acknowledges that it is a delicate balance to attend college and manage a start-up company — and he is grateful to his ENC professors who have

helped him navigate his courses while advising him regarding JOAGA.



Jose aspires to open multiple non-profits around the world to clear oceans of waste and transform it into different products. Coming up next — creating eyewear and credit cards from ocean waste!

JOAGO's November **Kickstarter campaign** was a success. According to Jose, *“The main goal is to end ocean waste as much as we can and increase awareness.”*
