Dr. Jossie Owens ('74) Continues to Break Barriers

Dr. Jossie Owens ('74) made history when she became the first black woman in the United States or Canada to be elected District Superintendent (DS) for the Church of the Nazarene (New England District). Throughout her career, Dr. Owens has created a powerful legacy of leadership and has been a strong advocate for women.

Owens' impressive career journey began when she was a child attending the historic Boston Chapel. ENC served as an invaluable resource to the church and Owens cites the ENC students who were involved as her primary motivation for later attending the College. "They saw the Gospel. They didn't see color. It reminded me of the table where we meet Christ: there's no boundaries, no barriers."

The Lions are Back in the Den



After nearly a year's hiatus from competition, Eastern Nazarene College's athletic teams have returned to the court, field, track, and more – with added precautionary measures surrounding COVID-19. Weekly testing, mask wearing, and social distancing practices have been implemented to ensure the health and safety of teams, coaches, and staff.

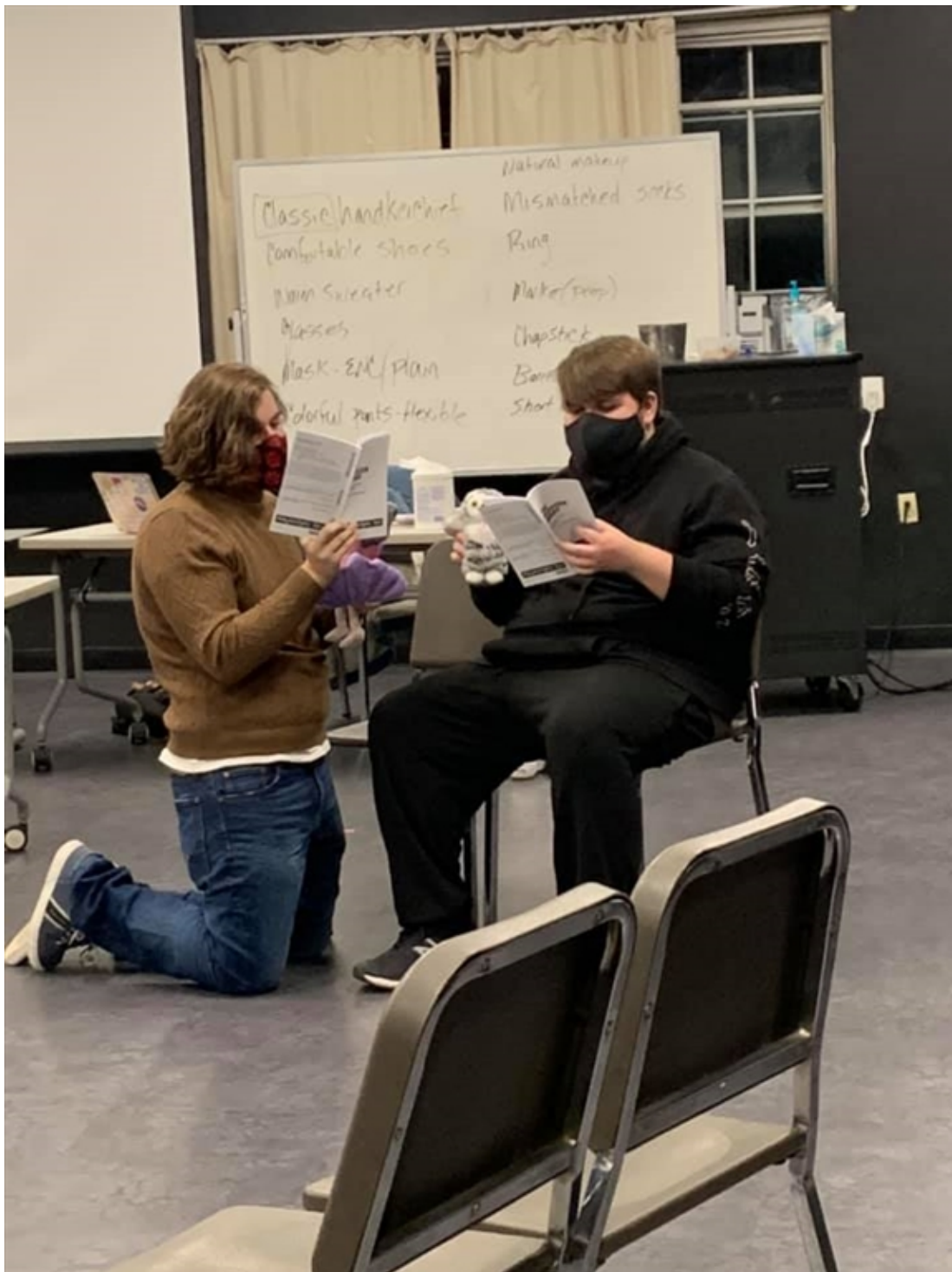
ENC's baseball, softball, and men's volleyball teams are in the midst of their conference seasons with league titles and NCAA Tournament berths at stake. The Lions' basketball, soccer, tennis, golf, and women's volleyball teams have all returned to competition with abbreviated schedules this spring. "Having the opportunity for our student-athletes to compete again has been a blessing. There has been so much work, behind the scenes, from our athletic trainers and our testing center to make this happen, commented head women's basketball coach Sacha Santimano. "We are thankful for each day that goes by and for the opportunities to step onto the court. Having the chance to coach this family is not something we take for granted. We continue to hope for a safe and healthy season for all our sports."

"It's great to see teams, not just practicing like the fall semester, but competing against other colleges and getting W's," said head men's and women's volleyball coach Derek Schmitt ('95). "What has really impressed me as a coach and someone who sees all the teams in action, has been the commitment of the athletes to their respective programs, practicing and

working out to get better, with no guarantee of how many games or matches they will play. A special shout-out goes to our two Athletic Trainers, Toni Kabilian ('00) and Katie Montalbo (M'20), who have been overseeing 15 teams practicing and competing at ALL hours of the day," added Schmitt.

No spectators are permitted to be at ENC home athletic events but many home games will be live-streamed for free at athletics.enc.edu.
